Kevin, I'm circling back on these questions. I also realized that I forgot to ask whether Secretary Pate has been in communication with the Iowa County Attorneys Association or any individual county attorneys about this. My understanding is that someone who tries to vote with a provisional ballot (sincerely thinking he or she is eligible) could later be subject to prosecution if it turns out they were accurately listed on the felon database.

It sounds like Secretary Pate is encouraging lowans to use a provisional ballot if there is doubt about their status. Has he received assurances that people acting in good faith won't be criminally charged later?
