Jack and Charles:

When our staff asked your staff about whether legislators and staff would be notified if anyone who has been to the Capitol tests positive for COVID-19, their answer was that you would follow standard "notification guidelines." We have not received additional information about what that means.

In light of reports that leaders of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives failed to notify all legislators that at least one Representative had tested positive for COVID-19 while the House was in session, there is growing concern by our Senators and staff about what protocols and notifications will be in place for the Iowa Legislature.
