Dear Attorney General Miller:

I am writing to request an official opinion regarding Governor appointed, Senate-confirmed appointments. First and foremost: If the Governor appoints an individual to a Senate-confirmed position, whether an interim or regular appointment, then the name is withdrawn by the Governor, is it legal for that individual to continue to serve in that Senate-confirmed position?

Specifically, can the Governor legally circumvent the required Senate confirmation process by routinely withdrawing a name before the Senate acts upon that appointment and then appointing the same individual to another position on the same board? For example, Erik Helland was appointed by Governor Reynolds in 2020 as a member of the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB). In 2021, the Governor withdrew Helland's name. The Senate did not act on the appointment because of the withdrawal in the 2021 session. Helland continue to serve in that position until the Governor appointed him as Chair and PERB member in 2021. The Governor then withdrew his name in 2022. The Senate did not act on the appointment because of the withdrawal in the 2022 session. Now the Governor sent a letter to the Senate which stated she appointed Erik Helland to PERB effective July 22, 2022. Erik Helland has been a PERB member since 2020 without ever receiving a Senate vote and seems to be destined to continue to do so until the Senate convenes again in 2023—when his name may be withdrawn again and then potentially reappointed to another open PERB position.

Additionally, can an appointee that fails to receive a two-thirds vote be reappointed to the same board but in a different position/term? Can an appointee that fails to receive a two-thirds vote be reappointed to the same board a year later? For example, Cheryl Arnold was appointed as the PERB Chair in 2019 and received disapproval from the Senate on June 10, 2020. Now, on August 15, 2022, Governor Reynolds appointed Arnold to PERB, replacing Erik Helland's position.

Finally, can a state board or commission operate when the board does not meet the partisan balance per lowa Code (69.16)? Since October 2021, the PERB membership consisted of two members of the same party and one vacancy. Further, can a board without a majority of its membership filled legally execute its duties? For example, if the board only has one of three members appointed, does it have the legal authority to act in its adjudicative and rule-making functions?

To be clear, while the concern is about these specific appointments to this specific board right now, it is certainly a legal question of great importance to establish if a governor can wholly avoid required Senate confirmations by leaving positions vacant on boards to allow interim appointments to be made and withdrawn indefinitely. It would seem that the current situation runs afoul of the law and erodes an essential aspect of the constitutionally shared powers of the legislative and executive branches of state government.

Another concern involving recent PERB changes is that PERB administrative law judges will no longer hear PERB cases and that Department of Inspection and Appeals judges will take on that function. DIA administrative law judges will, by result, now have extremely broad jurisdiction to evaluate claims and disputes across multiple areas of law. That result seems to run afoul of the due process protections afforded lowans as well as the statutory authority granting agencies the jurisdiction to resolve disputes. In determining what the legislature has permitted and prohibited, we look to the legislative intent in enacting the state statutes and we require that any local ordinance remain faithful to this legislative intent. In ascertaining legislative intent, we may consider the object sought to be obtained by the legislature in enacting the statute." Kennedy v. Civil Serv. Comm'n, 654 N.W.2d 511, 513-514 (2002). The Supreme Court has expressly held that a government entity "cannot surrender or contract away its governmental functions and powers" including judicial functions. "The power to 'hear and determine' ... refers to a judicial investigation in settlement of an issue of fact." Id. at 515. While Iowa Code section 20.6(4) allows PERB to generally transfer cases to DIA administrative law judges, section 20.11(2) more specifically requires a PERB-employee judge to preside over hearings: "The board may designate one of its members, an administrative law judge, or any other qualified person employed by the board to serve as the presiding officer at the hearing." Therefore, it is also necessary to have a formal opinion on the question of whether or not it is an illegal shift of an essential PERB duty to have specifically-assigned adjudication responsibilities transferred to an unrelated state agency.

I and many other members of the legislature thank you for your consideration of the crucially important topic and look forward to receiving your formal legal opinions on these pressing issues.
