Polling was conducted online from October 23-27, 2025. Using Dynamic Online Sampling to attain a representative sample, Change Research polled 638 likely 2026 voters in Iowa's 3rd Congressional District. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, education, and 2024 presidential vote.
